Our Background – Sheffield is the oldest town in Berkshire County, purchased from Chief Konkapot in 1724. Matthew Noble, the first English settler, arrived in 1725. The Town was incorporated in 1733. The Town is comprised of two villages, Sheffield and Ashley Falls.

The Town is noted for its deep agricultural roots and active farming continues to make Sheffield one of the most scenic towns in Massachusetts. There are still several active farms and agricultural businesses. The Housatonic River and mountain range add to the aesthetic beauty of Sheffield.

Our Blueprint for Success – Residents are able to enjoy the Bushnell Sage Library for their reading pleasure, computer use, programs and lovely grounds. The Sheffield Senior Center serves the needs of the elderly population by creating programs and offering services of all types. The Center also provides a transportation program to get the elderly population to medical appointments, shopping, programming at the Center along with many other needs. The Town Park has a pavilion for picnics, playground equipment and baseball fields. The Covered Bridge Park is a lovely setting to sit and watch the river flow or walk across a covered bridge.
